The European Journal of Legal Studies (EJLS), a researcher-run law journal based at the Department of Law of the EUI, is seeking new Junior Editors to join its Editorial Board.

The position is open to legal scholars, including early-career scholars and PhD candidates. As a minimum, applicants should have completed their undergraduate education and hold a graduate degree (in law or adjacent areas). We strongly encourage applications from scholars with expertise in European Union Law, International Law, Comparative Law, or Legal Theory.

Applicants should be affiliated with the European University Institute or a university part of [CIVICA](#). Scholars who have already completed their research in any of these universities are also welcome to apply.

Main tasks:

Reviewers conduct double-blind peer reviews of anonymised manuscripts in their field(s) of expertise. Comprehensive training on how to conduct academic peer review will be provided to new reviewers.

Being a reviewer is an interesting and rewarding experience: you will get insights into academic publishing, gain experience with peer-review, learn how to provide constructive feedback on a colleague's written work, how to avoid common writing mistakes, and how to improve the structure and style of your own writing.

Please send your CV and a Letter of Motivation (max. 1 page) highlighting your experience, current research topic or area, and area of expertise in law to ejls@eui.eu no later than **30 September 2026**. Please also include the three areas or sub-fields of law in which you are most equipped to review academic manuscripts, and the respective languages in which you are able to review. **Applicants must send their applications from their institutional email.**
